

## **MESSAGE from our DIRECTOR & PRESIDENT**

This year the Museum celebrated two of our nation's most significant accomplishments: the completion of the transcontinental railroad in 1869 and the 1969 Apollo 11 moon landing. For the railroad's 150th anniversary the Museum hosted a special exhibit, large format film, and numerous programs for community members of all ages. The moon landing was celebrated by sky viewing with our telescopes, on our super screen with the Apollo 11 documentary, and through several space-themed programs and events including Pie & the Sky and Astronomy on Tap.

While we took time this year to learn from our proud past, we also looked forward toward our promising future. In early 2019 we added online ticket sales for the first time. Patrons love how easy it is to sign up their kids for summer classes, purchase movie tickets, and renew their memberships. We also continued on our path to fully implementing Virtual

Field Trip (VFT) equipment into our program offerings. This year we received a VFT from the Henry Doorly Zoo during a premiere event, and sent a VFT to Good Samaritan Village.

Perhaps our most significant accomplishment of the year was the installation of compact shelving. This \$150,000 purchase nearly doubled our capacity for collections storage. We replaced stationary shelving with a modern moveable system on rails.

Thank you to our members, board members, patrons, the City of Hastings, the Hastings Museum Foundation, and the community of the Hastings for an amazing year.


